TRITEC Advances But Parking Issue Remains



The Patchogue Village Zoning Board of Appeals has adjourned until April 16 a varience request for the \$100 million project that would allow many of the private parking spaces to

be smaller that the 9 feet by 20 feet that the law requires. The request is for many 9' by 18' and some 8' by 18' feet spaces. The village has never granted relief for the 8 footers. The ZBA will consult with the planning board before making its decision.

The project was otherwise approved Mar. 10 in a rare split 4-3 decision by the Village Board.




