# A Message from the Village Building Department

It has come to our attention that many businesses and store owners are erecting signs on their buildings and in their windows for which a permit is required. Under Village Code 9327, all permanent signs placed on a building or in a store window must have a permit and approval from the Architectural Review Board.

These signs include but are not limited to all facade signs and window signs which include window lettering and illuminated signs. The use of neon borders around store windows is not permitted.

Applications can be obtained from the Building Department. For those business that have placed signs in their windows or on their buildings without a permit, you can expect to receive a letter from the Building Department outlining your violation and what is needed to receive ARB approval.

Failure to comply is a violation of village code and can result in a summons. If you have any questions regarding the Village Code as it applies to signage, please call the Building Department at 475-8942. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.
