Artspace For Terry Street

A \$19 million dollar, 70,000 square foot living/work space for artists would be built along Terry Street, just east of South Ocean Ave. under preliminary plans unveiled by Artspace Projects Inc. which has built similar projects across the country.

Plans call for 40 to 45 studio, one and two bedroom affordable apartments in three stories that would be restricted to rental by artists and musicians. A five story tower would house gallery space as well as stairs and an elevator.

Patchogue Village has set a Jan. 22 deadline for plans in order for an application to be submitted to New York State by the end of February. The hope is that the state and Suffolk County will buy the land and construct the building. If all goes well, ground breaking could come this summer.
