Chamber Raises Village Parking Issues

Concerned about recent evidence of a lack of parking on the street and in lots closest to stores, the Chamber has asked Village officials to consider measures aimed at improving customer parking.

As a first step, in an attempt to encourage store owners and employes to avoid all day parking in two hour spaces, the Village has agreed to step up parking rules enforcement beginning March 1.

Tickets will be issued for on street and parking lot violations of two hour, half hour and 15 minute, handicapped, and fire zone and loading zone ordinances. There will be no warnings.

It is vital that spaces closest to stores be kept available for customers. It is estimated that each parking space is worth \$250,000 a year in revenue.

Other longer term fixes are being considered, but in the meantime, please let your employees know that they should not use street parking or park in lot spaces closest to stores.

In a letter to merchants, Chamber Vice President Mindy Skura says "Continued disregard for (customer) convenience will drive them away to shop and do business elsewhere." Feel free to contact Mindy or Lori Belmonte at The Colony Shop with comments or ideas.
