# Patchogue Printing Celebrates 20 Years

20 years ago, Janet & Jim Pickett bought a print shop called McPrint. Jim an engineer and Janet, a teacher, began to learn a new career.

20 years later, they are still in business and thriving. The printing business has gone through many changes and Patchogue Printing has been keeping up. 20 years ago printing was done with presses that used chemicals. Chemicals were used to develop negatives and offset plates. The smells and the noise made it a difficult place to work for some people. Today, their presses are all digital and use soy based ink or toner. Jobs are sent directly from the computer to the machines, eliminating the toxic chemicals and noise of the presses. Use of recycled paper is also making the printing business more environmentally friendly.

Patchogue Printing is very involved in Patchogue and tries to give back to the community. They have given tours to girl scouts and boy scouts for badges, and assisted Briarcliffe students with producing their own yearbook. Janet was on the Board of Directors of the Patchogue-Medford Youth and Community Services for 13 years. Janet is a Vice-President of the Chamber and involved in many of their activities. Jim is a member of the Lions Club.
