End Of An Era Eloise Staudinger Dies At 101



Eloise Staudinger, who worked in her Main Street Colony Shop until well past her 101st birthday, died at her Patchogue home on April 17. She first opened The Colony Shop in 1946 after owning a knitting business and at one point managing a nightclub in Greenport. She was well known for her work ethic (including sweeping the street in front of her store) and for the level of customer service offered by her, her daughter Lari and granddaughter Lori.


