# Patchogue Post Office Named For Lt. Murphy

The Patchogue Post Office was formally named in honor of Navy Seal Lt. Michael P. Murphy in cermonies at the Post Office, Oct. 24, attended by several hundred people including New York Senator Hillary Clinton and 1st District Congressman Tim Bishop.

Lt. Murphy, a 1994 graduate of Patchogue-Medord High School, was killed in action in Afghanistan June 28, 2005. Legislation for the name

change was signed by President Bush in August.

Rear Admiral Joseph McGuire, the Navy Seals Commander, told the audience that Lt. Murphy put his own life at risk in an effort to save others in his team, one of which survived the enemy fire in the Afghanistan mountains where they had been dropped.

Lt. Murphy's parents, Dan and Maureen, and their son John presented photographs and a plaque which will be displayed in the Post Office.
