# **A Parade of Lights**




The Greater Patchogue Foundation and the Greater Patchogue Chamber of Commerce have sponsored a boat

parade on the Sunday before Thanksgiving each year since 1993. It's meant to kick off the holiday season which begins with Thanksgiving and ends with New Year's Day.

When the parade first began fifteen years ago, it was called "Santa on the River". Eight years ago the name was changed to the Holiday Boat Parade so there would be more theme variety for the boaters. This year the Patchogue Boat Parade—Parade of Lights will be held on Nov. 23, at 6:00 p.m.

The twenty or so boaters spend dozens of hours decorating their vessels using many themes. We have had turkeys for Thanksgiving, a tribute to 9/11, the New York Skyline, pirates, Winter Wonderland, and Frosty the Snowman. Santa is always on the last boat and gives candy canes to the children.

This year's parade theme is "The World—United". In these troubled times of war, terrorism and uncertainty we wanted to create a theme of togetherness, joy and hope.
