Good Bye To Clare Rose



A Patchogue fixture since 1936, Clare Rose, Inc., Long Island's largest beer distributer has moved from the village to a new 276,000 square foot facility at the southwest corner of the Long Island Expressway and William Floyd Parkway in Yaphank.

But the 12 acre property along Clare Rose boulevard may not be vacant for too long. Plans are well underway by a Rose family firm, RAM Associates, to build a condominium development. The Village Planning Board has approved a change of zone that would allow for 163 for-purchase units but has not yet given final approval for the project. Plans submitted to the board show two and three story attached units. The plan includes portions of Clare Rose Boulevard, South Street and Railroad Ave. and also includes a walk along the river.

The first phase, on the east side of the property, along Railroad Ave., is to include about 27 units. Full completion is expected to take more than 3 years. When fully occupied, about 400 residents will be added to the village.

New Four Corners Plan



This is TRITEC's latest plan for replacement of the old Swezey's store on the Four Corners. TRITEC is now planning a five story building with retail on the first floor and residential units above. The company scrapped plans for a hotel on the corner, citing economic conditions and the credit markets. Construction is planned to begin by next spring.

Proposed on East Main

The Patchogue Village Board has approved a zone change to allow a project at the corner of Bay Ave. and East Main Street that is proposed to house a bank, a 7-11 and a Checkers.

The project involves demolition of the three story building at 272 East Main St. and relocation in the village of Tires Incorporated.
