Ralph Zegel To Be Honored at Chamber Dinner

The Greater Patchogue Chamber of Commerce will hold its Annual Installation Dinner on Oct. 19 at Mediterranean Manor. The guest of honor will be long time Patchogue booster Ralph Zegel, referred to in the dinner invitations as "The Heart and Sole of Patchogue."

The "sole" part comes from his many years in the shoe business. Born in Patchogue, he started work at Cannon Shoes on South Ocean Avenue right after his graduation from Patchogue High School. He worked for the Suffolk County Department of Public Works for a time but went back to shoes in 1957, shortly after his marriage to Anna Murray. He bought Weiner Shoe Store from his boss, Mike Weiner, in 1972 and combined the business with Falkoff Shoes in 1982. At Weiners he became involved with the Patchogue Chamber of Commerce Promotion Committee and was later Chairman of the Merchants Division. He was the Chamber's Man of the Year in 1977 and joined the Chamber's Hall of Fame in 1992. He also served as a Director of The New York State Council of


