New Park Superintendent



The National Park Service has named Chris Soller as the new Superintendent at Fire Island National

Seashore. Soller, who will take over the job in November, succeeds Mike Reynolds who left Fire island in February to become Deputy Regional Director of the 13 state NPS Northeast Region, headquartered in Philadelphia.

Soller is a 31 year veteran of the National Park Service and the Department of the Interior. He comes to Patchogue from the NPS National Partnership Office in Washington, D.C., but has served previously as Superintendent of the Jamaica Bay Unit of Gateway National Recreation Area in New York City. He also worked at Fire island, in the 1980's as a Management Assistant.

A native of Youngstown, Ohio, Soller has an MA in Urban and environmental Planning from the University of Virginia and has lived for the last 30 years between Washington and Metropolitan New York. He and his partner of 15 years, Jack Curry, have maintained a home on Fire Island since 2000.

River Plan In Works



The Village of Patchogue is preparing a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) and Harbor Management Plan (HMP) for its river and bay front areas. Two public hearings have been held on the draft pro-

posal, prepared with the help of consultants, and public comments continue to be accepted before a vote by the Village Board and submission for state approval. A

copy of the proposal is available at the village website: www.patchoguevillage.org.

Tha plan recommends future uses within the study area that maintain and strengthen "Patchogue's identity as a historic south shore village and maritime center." It says new development should encourage tourists to extend their visit to Patchogue and provide a connection to Main Street. New multiple family residential development is encouraged within walking distance of downtown and the LIRR station. It says commercial and industrial use along the river should be water-dependant or water-enhanced. It says a key goal is increased public access to the waterfront and to the river in particular.. It recommends non-motorized boat launches at several locations.

Comments on the plan should be submitted in writing to the Village Clerk.



The plan notes that the East Jetty at the entrance to the river, maintained by the Town of Brookhaven, is in need of reconstruction.
