Plaza Theatre Condemnation Advances



The Plaza Theatre on East Main Street, which showed its last movie more than twenty years ago, may be closer to demolition. Brookhaven Town is considering acquiring the rundown property by eminent domain and will continue a public hearing on the proposal on Oct. 27. The town has 90 days after the

close of the hearing to vote on condemnation. If approved, a judge will eventually decide the price.

Town officials say the owner, Manhattan real estate developer Edmondo Schwartz, has not cooperated in efforts to buy the property which the town has appraised at \$1.4 million. Schwartz reportedly wants a million dollars more. Neighborhood pressure to demolish the building is increasing. About 40 people attended a rally at the site on Sept. 26.
