# **TRITEC: Plan B**

### No Hotel

TRITEC Real Estate Company, Inc., which earlier had tweaked its massive Four Corners-West Main Street development plan, has now made a major change. It has dropped its proposal for a 111 room hotel at the corner.



Citing economic conditions and the credit market, the company now says it will substitute a five story highend rental apartment building for the seven story hotel.

It appears that other plans for the site remain

mostly unchanged. The company originally said it would build, in addition to the hotel, 28,000 square feet of retail space and four story residential units atop one



story parking garages along Lake Street as well as residential and retail development along Havens Ave. The company is now completing its renovation of the 31 West Main Street office building with first floor retail. It says 90 percent of the office space has been leased and proposals are out on the majority of the retail space as well.

TRITEC President Robert Coughlan told Patchogue Patch that he hopes to start the Four Corners construction by the end of the first quarter of 2011.
